**SUBJECT:** 2012-13 Commodity Quote Recommendations

There were three quotes submitted for the bakery products; two quotes for dairy products and LP Gas; and one quote for trash removal service. Quote amounts are reflected on the attached spreadsheets:

- 1. Aunt Millie's Bakeries, Interstate Brands and Klosterman Baking Company provided quotes for the bakery products. Because some of the quoted packaged products contained different packaging count sizes, you will notice some variance in the quantity amounts between vendors. The quantity amounts were changed in order to break down the costs and compare "apples to apples". Aunt Millie's Bakeries, our current provider, provided a quote of \$14,181; while Klosterman Baking Company quote came in at \$14,670. They are once again close quotes with only a \$489 difference between them. Interstate Brand submitted a quote of \$16,207. I recommend the board approve Aunt Millie's Bakeries as our bakery provider for the 2012-2013 school year. They have been very pleased with their service and the quality of their product.
- 2. There were two quotes for the dairy products which included a firm and an escalator quote: Prairie Farms and Schenkel's Dairy. The Corporation has always opted to go with the firm price for the dairy needs. Prairie Farms submitted a firm quote of \$52,761.60 while Schenkel's Dairy firm quote totaled \$51,591.60 which is a difference of \$1,170. Pam Swisher, School Lunch Director, informed me that when Schenkel's Dairy was the dairy provider that there were several issues with product delivery. Since these quotes are fairly close, the School Lunch Director would prefer to continue with Prairie Farm who has a slightly higher quote due to the fact that they are the more responsible company. I recommend the board approve Prairie Farms as the 2012-2013 dairy product provider.
- 3. There was only one quote for the 2012-2013 trash removal service. Smith Trash Service submitted a quote of \$2,000.00 per month for the months of August, 2012 thru May, 2013 with a \$60.00 cost for any additional pick up during June and July. Last year, Smith Trash Service received the bid of \$1,800.00 per month with a \$60.00 cost for any additional pick up during the summer months. I recommend the board approve the quote from Smith Trash Service.
- 4. There were quotes received from AmeriGas and Co-Alliance for the 2012-2013 LP Gas. Amerigas gave a firm quote of \$1.4555 and then a floating quote of \$.30 over the fixed margin of the AmeriGas Market Index Price which would currently be \$1.409. Co-Alliance gave a firm quote of \$1.4355 and a floating quote of \$.15 margin over terminal which stands at \$1.2771 on 5/2/12. I am recommending that the board accept the lowest firm price from Co-Alliance which is \$1.4355.

In addition, students in Grades 1, 3, and 5 may be considered for evaluation with a teacher or parent request, or if the student is a new enrollee and whose school records indicate that the child qualified for high ability programming at the school where the child was previously enrolled. Students who qualify for the High Ability program in previous grades will be reassessed and must qualify for high ability in 4th grade in order to continue in the program. All students in Grades K, 2, 4, and 6 are evaluated for high ability at the beginning of each school year. In addition, students in Grades 1, 3, and 5 may be considered for evaluation with a teacher or parent request, or if the student is a new enrollee and whose school records indicate that the child qualified for high ability programming at the school where the child was previously enrolled.

Students who qualify for the High Ability program in previous grades will be reassessed and must qualify for high ability in  $4^{th}$  grade in order to continue in the program.

If a student is not chosen to participate in the program, a teacher or parent may submit a formal appeal in writing using the Appeal Form available from the school principal or with a written letter to the Placement Committee stating the reasons why they would like the child to be reconsidered. Parents may also submit additional information as evidence of the child's academic ability.

The G/T Program stresses higher level thinking skills, extensive work in academic areas, and students' work on projects that encourage creative solutions.

Beginning with the second semester, second grade students who are identified in both reading and math will meet with the high ability resource teacher for 2 hours every-other week.

Students in third, fourth, fifth, and sixth grades who are identified in both reading and math will meet for 1 hour once a week with the high ability resource teacher.

# **GENERAL FUND COMPARISON REPORT:**

As of the end of April, 2012 the General Fund cash balance is \$1,707,163. In the General Fund as of April 30, 2012, we have had a total expenditure of \$3,387,396 or 29% of the 2012 General Fund Appropriated Budget of \$11,782,150.

# **Choice Savings Special Distribution:**

On April 25<sup>th</sup>, we were notified by the Indiana Department of Education that a special distribution will be made on May 18<sup>th</sup> to each school corporation and charter school, excluding virtual charter schools, based on the savings resulting from the Choice Scholarship program which was implemented. Western Boone's distribution amount is set to be \$6,617.96. These dollars are to be receipted into the General Fund.
