





■ Common School Fund Loan - A1856


■ First Mortgage Refunding Bonds, Series 2008

COMPARISON OF 2015 CERTIFIED TOTAL TAX RATES



PROJECT RESOLUTION - JR/SR HIGH SCHOOL PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Western Boone Community School Corporation Board of School Trustees at a meeting on December 14, 2015, held a public hearing in accordance with I.C. 20-26-7-37 for the purpose of answering questions and listening to taxpayers' comments and any evidence they may present about the proposed renovation of and improvements to Western Boone Jr/Sr High School including site improvements (the "Jr/Sr High School Project"), and;

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees have carefully studied all of the known options and feel that the proposed Jr/Sr High School Project is in the best interest of the present and future students to be served by this facility as well as the taxpayers of the school corporation; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Jr/Sr High School Project is necessary for the purpose of providing an improved educational program and environment for students.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the estimated hard and soft construction cost of the Jr/Sr High School Project is \$1,950,000 and the cost of issuance paid from Bond proceeds is \$40,000 resulting in a total estimated Jr/Sr High School Project cost of \$1,990,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the estimated \$1,990,000 will be funded by Capital Projects Fund and a General Obligation Bond Issue with an anticipated impact on the Debt Service Fund tax rate of \$0.0391 per \$100 assessed valuation based on the current \$638,937,450 assessed valuation beginning 2017.

PROJECT RESOLUTION - ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Western Boone Community School Corporation Board of School Trustees at a meeting on December 14, 2015, held a public hearing in accordance with I.C. 20-26-7-37 for the purpose of answering questions and listening to taxpayers' comments and any evidence they may present about the proposed renovation of and improvements to Granville Wells Elementary and Thorntown Elementary (the "Elementary Schools Project"), and:

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees does not expect the work to be financed to exceed \$1,000,000 at any one building as part of the Elementary Schools Project, in order to provide taxpayers with the most information, it has decided to hold a project hearing for this project pursuant to I.C. 20-26-7-37; and

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees have carefully studied all of the known options and feel that the proposed Elementary Schools Project is in the best interest of the present and future students to be served by these facilities as well as the taxpayers of the school corporation; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Elementary Schools Project is necessary for the purpose of providing an improved educational program and environment for students.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the estimated hard and soft construction cost of the Elementary Schools Project is \$940,000 and the cost of issuance paid from Bond proceeds is \$35,000 resulting in a total estimated Elementary Schools Project cost of \$975,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the estimated \$975,000 will be funded by Capital Projects Fund and a General Obligation Bond Issue with an anticipated impact on the Debt

Service Fund tax rate of \$0.0192 per \$100 assessed valuation based on the current \$638,937,450 assessed valuation beginning 2017.

EXHIBIT C

PRELIMINARY BOND RESOLUTION - JR/SR HIGH SCHOOL PROJECT

WHEREAS, Western Boone Community School Corporation (the "Issuer" or "School Corporation") is a school corporation organized and existing under the provisions of I.C. 20-23; and

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees funds that the present facilities of the School Corporation are not adequate to provide the proper education of the pupils now attending or who will attend its schools; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that there are not sufficient funds available or provided for in existing tax levies with which to pay the total cost of the renovation of and improvements to Western Boone Jr/Sr High School including site improvements in said School Corporation (the "Jr/Sr High School Project"), and that the School Corporation should issue bonds in an amount not to exceed One Million Nine Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$1,990,000) for the purpose of providing funds to be applied on the Jr/Sr High School Project, and that bonds in such maximum amount should now be authorized; and

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of School Trustees of the Issuer that, for the purpose of obtaining funds to be applied on the cost of the Jr Sr High School Project, there shall be issued and sold the negotiable, general obligations of the School Corporation to be designated as "General Obligation Bonds of 2016." Said bonds shall be in a principal amount not to exceed One Million Nine Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$1,990,000), bearing interest at a rate or rates not exceeding five percent (5.00%) per annum (the exact rate or rates to be determined by bidding), which interest shall be payable on January 15 and July 15 in each year beginning July 15, 2017. The bonds shall be fully registered in the denomination of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) or integral multiples thereof (or other denominations as requested by the winning bidder), and shall mature serially or be subject to mandatory redemption on January 15 and July 15 beginning July 15, 2017 through not later than January 15, 2026. The Bonds shall be redeemable on the dates and in the amounts as determined by the Issuer.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that prior to the sale of said bonds at public sale, notice of such sale shall be published once each week for two (2) weeks in The Lebanon Reporter, the first of said publications to be at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date fixed for the sale of said bonds and the last at least three (3) days prior, and in the Court and Commercial Record, a newspaper published in the City of Indianapolis, Indiana. At the time fixed for the opening of bids, the Board or its designated committee shall meet, all bids shall be opened in the presence of the Board or such committee, and the award shall be made by the Board or Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of School Trustees of the Issuer that the matter of appropriating the proceeds of the bonds authorized at this meeting be taken up for consideration as soon as notice of the hearing on said appropriation can be given as provided by law, and that the Secretary of the Board be and he hereby is directed to give notice of the public

hearing to be held prior to the final action on such appropriation, which notice shall be published in <u>The Lebanon Reporter</u> at least ten (10) days prior to the date set for such public hearing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Board be and hereby is directed to give notice of the determination to issue the Bonds, which notice shall be published twice, one week apart, in <u>The Lebanon Reporter</u>; also, that said notice shall be posted in three (3) public places in the School Corporation.

PRELIMINARY BOND RESOLUTION - ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS PROJECT

WHEREAS, Western Boone Community School Corporation (the "Issuer" or "School Corporation") is a school corporation organized and existing under the provisions of LC. 20-23; and

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees finds that the present facilities of the School Corporation are not adequate to provide the proper education of the pupils now attending or who will attend its schools; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that there are not sufficient funds available or provided for in existing tax levies with which to pay the total cost of the renovation of and improvements to Granville Wells Elementary and Thorntown Elementary in said School Corporation (the "Elementary Schools Project"), and that the School Corporation should issue bonds in an amount not to exceed Nine Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$975,000) for the purpose of providing funds to be applied on the Elementary Schools Project, and that bonds in such maximum amount should now be authorized; and

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of School Trustees of the Issuer that, for the purpose of obtaining funds to be applied on the cost of the Elementary Schools Project, there shall be issued and sold the negotiable, general obligations of the School Corporation to be designated as "General Obligation Bonds of 2016." Said bonds shall be in a principal amount not to exceed Nine Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$975,000), bearing interest at a rate or rates not exceeding five percent (5.00%) per annum (the exact rate or rates to be determined by bidding), which interest shall be payable on January 15 and July 15 in each year beginning July 15, 2017. The bonds shall be fully registered in the denomination of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) or integral multiples thereof (or other denominations as requested by the winning bidder), and shall mature serially or be subject to mandatory redemption on January 15 and July 15 beginning July 15, 2017 through not later than January 15, 2026. The Bonds shall be redeemable on the dates and in the amounts as determined by the Issuer.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that prior to the sale of said bonds at public sale, notice of such sale shall be published once each week for two (2) weeks in The Lebanon Reporter, the first of said publications to be at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date fixed for the sale of said bonds and the last at least three (3) days prior, and in the Court and Commercial Record, a newspaper published in the City of Indianapolis, Indiana. At the time fixed for the opening of bids, the Board or its designated committee shall meet, all bids shall be opened in the presence of the Board or such committee, and the award shall be made by the Board or Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of School Trustees of the Issuer that the matter of appropriating the proceeds of the bonds authorized at this meeting be taken up for consideration as soon as notice of the hearing on said appropriation can be given as provided by law, and that the Sccretary of the Board be and he hereby is directed to give notice of the public

hearing to be held prior to the final action on such appropriation, which notice shall be published in <u>The Lebanon Reporter</u> at least ten (10) days prior to the date set for such public hearing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Board be and hereby is directed to give notice of the determination to issue the Bonds, which notice shall be published twice, one week apart, in <u>The Lebanon Reporter</u>; also, that said notice shall be posted in three (3) public places in the School Corporation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the School declares its official intent to acquire, construct or rehabilitate the Jr/Sr High School Project with proceeds of debt incurred by the School Corporation in an amount not to exceed \$1,990,000 for the purpose of paying or reimbursing costs of the Jr/Sr High School Project.

BE IT FURTER RESOLVED that the School declares its official intent to acquire, construct or rehabilitate the Elementary Schools Project with proceeds of debt incurred by the School Corporation in an amount not to exceed \$975,000 for the purpose of paying or reimbursing costs of the Elementary Schools Project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the School Corporation reasonably expects to reimburse itself from proceeds of obligations issued by the School Corporation for costs of the Projects paid prior to the issuance of the obligations.
