## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into by and between Western Boone Community School Corporation (WBCCSC) and the Boone County Sheriff's Office, (BCSO) (collectively, WBCCSC and BCSO are the "Parties"), and is dated \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2019.

## Recitals

WHEREAS, WBCCSC operates four facilities ("WBCCSC Facilities")

WBCCSC Administration Center - at 1203 N Sr 75 Thorntown, IN 45071

Western Boone Jr. Sr. High School – 1205 N Sr 75 Thorntown, IN 46071

Thorntown Elementary School 200 W Mill St Thorntown, IN 46071

Granville Wells Elementary School 5046 S Sr 75 Jamesłown, IN 46147

WHEREAS, the BCSO provides WBCCSC with Central Dispatch communications with emergency services, including police, fire, and paramedic services as such are needed from time to time;

WHEREAS, WBCCSC has caused fixed video surveillance cameras (the "Cameras") to be installed throughout the WBCCSC Facilities to aid in the safety and security of WBCCSC students, staff, and property;

WHEREAS, the Cameras have the capability to share live streaming video from the WBCCSC Facilities with BCSO's Public Safety Dispatch Center and certain of BCSO's police, fire, and paramedic vehicles;

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize that during an "Emergency Situation," as defined below, the Parties would derive substantial benefit from the ability to share information quickly from live streaming video from the Cameras with BCSO's Central Dispatch, allowing critical decisions to be made using real time awareness of such a situation;

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize that certain privacy concerns exist, and that BCSO's Central Dispatch access to the Cameras should be limited to Emergency Situations during which access would enhance BCSO's response to such situations, and to necessary maintenance, testing, training, and evaluation related to supporting such access; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have agreed to the terms of this MOU to satisfy each of the foregoing interests and concerns.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual undertakings herein set forth, and for other good and valuable consideration, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. The foregoing Recitals are made a part hereof and incorporated into this MOU.
- For purposes of this MOU, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

for each. At least one of the BCSO Authorized Officials shall be available to authorize use of the Sharing System as described in subparagraph 3(a) of this MOU on a 24-hours-per-day / 365-days-per-year basis. The BCSO shall advise WBCCSC of any change in a BCSO Authorized Official or in contact information for any such Authorized Official within seven (7) days of such change.

- Upon execution of this MOU, the Parties shall promptly undertake such measures as are necessary to facilitate use of the Sharing System, and shall work cooperatively to make the Sharing System available to the BCSO as soon as practicable. The Parties shall each bear their own expenses related to the Sharing System.
- 6. This MOU may be terminated by either Party upon 14 days' written notice to the other Party

## **USE OF TOBACCO ON SCHOOL PREMISES**

BP - 1370

The school board recognizes that the use of tobacco presents a health hazard which can have serious consequences both for the user and the nonuser and is, therefore, of concern to the board.

For the purpose of this policy, "use of tobacco" shall mean all uses of tobacco, including a cigar, cigarette, pipe, snuff, or any other matter or substance that contains tobacco, as well as electronic, "vapor", or other substitute forms of cigarettes.

In order to protect students and staff who choose not to use tobacco from an environment noxious to them, the board prohibits the use of tobacco in school buildings, on school grounds, in school vehicles, or at any school-related event effective July 1, 2005.

Re: Reading Curriculum Recommendation

The following curriculum program recommendations are submitted for approval for the adoption period spanning July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2025:

Grades K-5: Wonders by McGraw-Hill

Grade 6: Into Literature by Houghton Mifflin Harcourt

The members of the Elementary Reading Adoption Committee set out in November to review current and new literacy curriculum for the upcoming adoption period of 2019-2025. All kindergarten through sixth grade teachers were asked to complete a survey to help the committee identify the top priorities for a core balanced literacy program. The survey results revealed three clear instructional priorities: a literacy program that balanced rigorous reading instruction with a structured writing component and a strong phonics foundation for primary grades with embedded vocabulary and grammar instruction at the intermediate grades.

The committee used an evaluation rubric to review programs from several publishers. At grades K-5, the committee found Wonders best met the instructional priorities with a balance of rigorous literacy instruction and structured writing instruction with a solid phonics foundation at the primary grades. Other strengths of the program that led the committee to recommend Wonders were support for differentiated instruction with leveled texts and plans for small group instruction, access to digital resources to provide additional practice and development of digital literacy through application, and integrated vocabulary, grammar, handwriting, and spelling components to teach related language arts skills in context rather than in isolation.

At sixth grade, the teachers weighed the balanced literacy priorities with the need for age-appropriate curriculum that was relevant and engaging to upper elementary students. While other programs provided rigorous content and solid writing instruction, what really set Into Literature apart from the other programs for sixth grade was the age-appropriate content that captured students' interest when the teachers tried out the instructional resources in their classrooms.



After considerable discussion and review, the committee recommends Wonders by McGraw Hill for grades kindergarten through five and Into Literature by Houghton Mifflin Harcourt for grade 6. Both programs offer blended print/digital format options for classroom implementation.
