RESOLUTION APPROVING FORM OF FOURTH AMENDMENT TO LEASE

WHEREAS, Western Boone Multi-School Building Corporation (the "Building Corporation") has previously been organized pursuant to the Indiana Nonprofit Corporation Act of 1991 for the purpose of constructing, renovating and improving facilities for the use of the Western Boone County Community School Corporation (the "School Corporation"); and

WHEREAS, the attorneys for Building Corporation have drafted and submitted a proposed Fourth Amendment to Lease (the "Fourth Amendment") for the additions to be constructed at Thorntown Elementary School building (the "2021 Leased Premises"); and

WHEREAS, preliminary plans and estimates (collectively, the "Documents") for the completion of the 2021 Leased Premises have been prepared; and

WHEREAS, the Documents have been submitted to and now meet with the approval of this Board of School Trustees (the "Board"); and

WHEREAS, such Documents have been marked to indicate the work covered by the proposed Fourth Amendment; and

WHEREAS, it now appears to this Board that said preliminary Documents provide the necessary facilities for the students of the School Corporation, and that the proposed Fourth Amendment with the Building Corporation provides for a fair and reasonable rental; and

WHEREAS, by statute the Building Corporation is required to own the real estate to be leased to the School Corporation, and the School Corporation is required to have the value of the real estate determined by court-appointed appraisers; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the terms and conditions of the proposed form of Fourth Amendment and the Documents are approved and agreed to as the basis for a hearing, as required by law, and that such hearing should be held by this board upon the necessity for the

execution of such Fourth Amendment and whether the Lease rental provided therein is a fair and reasonable rental for the proposed building, prior to final determination of such questions, so that this Board may determine whether to execute such Fourth Amendment as now written, or as modified.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of the Board is authorized and directed to publish a notice of such hearing as required by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the counsel for the School Corporation or the Superintendent of the School Corporation is authorized and directed to select three appraisers to appraise the Leased Premises and to petition the Boone County Circuit Court (the "Court") to obtain an order approving the appraisal pursuant to Indiana Code § 20-47-3.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, any officers of the Board are authorized to execute a deed and sell the real estate at a price not less than that fixed by the Court.

EXHIBIT B

RESOLUTION REAPPROVING BUILDING CORPORATION

WHEREAS, Western Boone Multi-School Building Corporation (the "Building Corporation") has been formed as a not-for-profit corporation to assist in financing, renovating, constructing and improving facilities within the Western Boone County Community School Corporation (the "School Corporation"); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of School Trustees (the "Board") of the School Corporation, as follows:

SECTION 1. That it is hereby determined to be proper and in the public interest of the citizens of this School Corporation to reapprove the incorporation of the Building Corporation known and designated as the "Western Boone Multi-School Building Corporation" for the purpose of financing, renovating, constructing and equipping certain school facilities and leasing same to this School Corporation.

SECTION 2. That the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Building Corporation, previously presented to the Board, are hereby reapproved.

SECTION 3. That providing for the financing, renovating, constructing and equipping of such school facilities by the Building Corporation and the leasing of same to this School Corporation is in the public interest of the citizens of this School Corporation, and it is a proper public purpose for which this Board agrees to cooperate with the Building Corporation and to assist it in fulfilling the requirements of all agencies of the federal, state and local governments.

SECTION 4. That the issuance, sale and delivery by the Building Corporation of one or more series of bonds designated "Western Boone Multi-School Building Corporation Ad Valorem Property Tax First Mortgage Bonds, Series 2022" (or such other name or series

designation as determined at the time of sale) (the "Bonds") in the aggregate principal amount of approximately \$16,500,000 is hereby approved.

SECTION 5. That, upon the redemption or retirement of the Bonds, the School Corporation will accept from the Building Corporation title to such school facilities, free and clear of any and all liens and encumbrances thereon.

<u>SECTION 6</u>. That this Board hereby reapproves the current Directors of the Building Corporation.

SECTION 7. That the Building Corporation may issue, sell and deliver the Bonds, pursuant to the applicable laws of the State of Indiana, may encumber any real property or equipment acquired by it for the purpose of financing the construction and equipping of such school facilities and may enter into contracts for the sale of the Bonds and the construction and acquisition of such school facilities.

Below is a highlight of the notable revisions to the Thorntown Elementary Student Handbook for the 2021-2022 school year:

Page 5 Arrival & Departure - language updated to reflect changes made throughout this year; new language is as follows:

We appreciate your cooperation with arrival and dismissal procedures. The priority is getting kids to and from school safely and it takes all of us to make that happen.

For students who are car riders to or from school, we need you to use the car rider line that crosses at Market Street and enters our east parking lot. This keeps the traffic down in front of our building where walkers and bike riders need to cross.

For parents who must travel down Mill Street during arrival/dismissal, we ask that you keep traffic limited to eastbound travel only from 75. The only parents who should be dropping students off at the front entrance are families with Western Boone Jr/Sr High students who need to catch the school bus. Please release students quickly so we can keep traffic flowing. If you need to park to assist them with getting out of the car, please use the car rider line or park in the east parking lot and walk your child around to the front door when you are ready.

Vine Street is closed to car traffic before and after school, and this is our designated safe zone for students walking and biking to or from school. Please familiarize your students with this area.

Arrival - Students should not arrive prior to 7:30. The doors will open at 7:40, so encourage them to come as close to 7:40 as possible. Tardy bell rings at 7:55. All walkers and bike riders should travel down Vine Street and cross with the crossing guard. If you have students who catch the bus to Western Boone, they need to board the bus at 7:40. I am not able to hold buses for students once they have started their engines to pull away from the school.

Dismissal - Walkers and Bus Riders will be dismissed after buses have exited the front drive. We need all walkers and bike riders to cross Mill Street with the crossing quard and travel north down Vine Street. We realize many parents and caregivers meet their children and walk to the gas station after school. However, we need everyone, even those with adult supervision, to travel down Vine at least one block before breaking off toward the gas station. It is difficult to keep unattended students from following the crowd toward 75 during this busy time.

Page 6 - Textbook Fees - language changed to exclude actual amount of fees; fees fluctuate from year to year and are not always available at the time we need to publish student handbooks; information in student handbook explains how fees are determined and expectations/methods for paying for fees

<u>Page 7 - Attendance</u> - no changes to district attendance policy; note added:

Additional information may be available to guide our response to attendance/absences (Based on our county's response to COVID)Page 7 - Attendance (clarifying revision, in response to frequent absence requests)

Prearranged or Extended Absences:

If a student is going miss school for a planned absence, parents/guardians must have the absence acknowledged by completing the prearranged absence form (from the main office) at least one week in advance of the function. Prearranged or extended absences will be counted as undocumented, except in cases where a medical leave of absence is necessary and documented. For absences for reasons other than medical recovery, work will be provided upon the student's return and will need to be completed at home and returned within one week.

Page 8 - Attendance: Make Up Work (revision, with regards to virtual learning option)

MAKE UP WORK

In most cases, student materials can be picked up from school by 8:30 am, the morning of an absence. Teacher will be notified that the child will be out and whether the child is well enough to participate in virtual instruction. Students who are ill and unable to participate in the virtual lessons will have one day for each day of their absence to complete and return make up work,

Page 10 - School Messenger System - language revision only; new language below:

The School Messenger Notification System is a web-based system that allows Western Boone School officials to send immediate notification of emergency information of official information to all home telephones, cell phones, or email addresses in a matter of minutes to all subscribed parents and patrons. Upon enrollment at WB school, the parent is automatically subscribed to the School Messenger system. To unsubscribe, parents may notify the school office.

School Messenger will also deliver text messages with important information about upcoming events, school closings, safety alerts, and more. You can participate in this free service by sending a text message 'Y' to school's short code number, 67587. You can opt out of these messages at any time by simply replying to one of our messages with "stop".

Page 15 - School Resource Officer - language revised in anticipation for staff changes; new language below:

Each Western Boone school has a full-time SRO on-site throughout each school day. These officers contribute to the school culture to foster a sense of safety and security. They also engage with students throughout the building as a positive role model. DARE is taught to students in grades K-6 by our DARE officer.
