- Higher student engagement in class assignments




### Survey Results (cont.)

## Survey Results (cont.)


 What type of internet connection do you have at home?

#### The Impact in English Classrooms

- Research projects created and submitted on My Big Campus
- Increased discussion participation from each students due to various ways to submit answers and opinions
- Increased collaboration and sharing of ideas among students
- Real time comprehension, assessment, and feedback
- Reduced copying and increased student accountability





## Steps Already Taken

- Laptops (Lenovo Twist) for all staff members in January of 2014.
- Professional development throughout 2013-14 & 2014-15.
   Emphasis placed on MyBigCampus.
  - MBC an educational hub between students, teachers, and the Web that takes all the features of an LMS (like lessons, assignments, reporting, calendars) and puts them into a safe, collaborative community.
- Laptops in all language arts classes and media center.
- Media Center redesigned and a focus has been placed on e-books.
- Students allowed to bring own devices at teacher discretion.



### Steps Taken (cont.)

- 1:1 Committee Formed K. Whiteley, T. Reed, R.
   Ramey, A. Pond, M. Riggins, A. Vaughn, D. Pierce, A.
   Cornelius, A. Conrad, and B. Walker.
- Site Visits to Batesville High School and North Daviess Junior-Senior High School.
- Teachers field tested demo units to determine best suitable device.
- Discussed technology integration and device choices with current students



### Plan of Action

- Beginning 2015-16 school year, all students will have a laptop.
- All 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders will be given the Lenovos purchased prior to the 2014-15 school year for use in language arts.
- 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade will be given a HP Probook 645.
- 3 Mobile Mac Labs and all desktops in current computer labs will be redistributed to elementary schools.



### Plan of Action (Cont.)

- Lab with IMacs will remain at WeBo.
- Current computer labs will be converted to collaborative learning spaces.
- Create help desk in the Media Center to assist with trouble shooting, etc.



### Infrastructure Upgrades

- Adding 20 wireless access points to WBHS bringing total to 81 APs including one in every classroom
- Upgrading Internet bandwidth from 45 Mbps to 400 Mbps
- Expanding fiber optics connectivity from WBHS to elementary schools with plans to connect Administration Building in the spring of 2015
- Implementing MS Office 365 giving students access to MS products and OneDrive for cloudbased storage

### Financing 1:1 Initiative

- Lenovos will be in year 2 of a 4 year lease program.
- HP Probook 645 will be purchased for a total of \$283,800.00 (600 machines x \$473). Initial cost will be paid for using the Common School Loan (Debt Services).
- Fee of \$25 will be charged each semester for Lenovo and HP machines.



### Adoption of Textbooks

- Beginning with 2014-15, departments will no longer adopt textbooks for individual students to rent in classes that are not dual credit or AP. Classroom sets will be available and on-line access to textbooks will be explored.
- When available, class specific web-based programs may be utilized.
- For dual credit and/or AP classes, students may still be required to rent and/or buy books.
- Course fees may still be required for classes. (Ex: Ceramics, Nutrition and Wellness)



### Expectations

- Improve digital citizenship.
- Equip students with a laptop that can be utilized in all content areas.
- Provide professional development to help staff become more familiar with the laptops and appropriate applications.
- Evolve Instruction over time to incorporate the use of technology.
